Members of Bidston Community Archaeology, who were carrying out the dig, were keen to explain what they were doing and to let the children have a go at digging (one of our pupils shows her find, right). The children were very excited to find various bits of floor tile, brick and pottery - all evidence of small fires that could have been used to cook on – as well as glass beads, a copper coin and pieces of clay pipe.

THE ARCHAEOLOGY of GREAT BUDWORTH

t has been an excellent autumn for budding archaeologists in the area.

First of all, at the end of September The North West region of Metal Detecting Clubs had a rally at Stockley Farm. More than 340 detectorists from all over North West England turned up on the day - there was enough land for all of them and the weather was excellent. They made some interesting finds, including medieval silver coins and a gold posy ring, which is also medieval and has been recorded as a Treasure Trove item. The ring will eventually be



valued by the British Museum and the funds raised from selling it will be shared by the finder and the Arley Estate.

Secondly, the Bidston Community Archaeology Group asked if we could arrange a weekend in October digging test pits in the village. The Bidston Group came last year, when they found, in Don Hammond's garden, a lead seal which bears an interesting inscription and is identified as 17th Century.

This time, the original plan was to dig pits on the School field, on John Williamson's land down Southbank and in some gardens. However, the group only managed to dig three pits on the School field. The top soil was deeper than expected. However, some mildly interesting items were found, including a coin and some clay pipes. One clay pipe bowl was very small, indicating it was very old as it would have been made and used at a time when tobacco was expensive. Towards the end of the final day a timber beam was found buried in the hole nearest to the school. This was much bigger than the test pit, so was left in place. It was low down near the subsoil and was possibly left over from building the church.

Probably the most pleasing aspect of the weekend was the number of school-children who came out over the weekend to see the expert archaeologists at work. Some of them even got hold of a trowel and helped with digging!

The Bidston Community Archaeology Group have asked if they can come again next year at the May Bank holiday for three days. We will let you know the details in the spring next year. Let us know if you – or anyone you know – is interested in archaeology.

DECEMBER & JANUARY IN THE GARDEN

by Tom Acton, Former Head Gardener at Arley Hall

Helleborus niger and its hybrids are known as the Christmas Rose (right), whose large flat flowers can adorn shady corners of the garden in winter. Over the years the Christmas Rose has been crossed with other species of Hellebore, such as H. corsicus and H. lividus. Some selections made from these crosses are excellent, early flowering, and elegant additions to the winter garden scene. Hellebore foliage is usually grey/green at about 1 ft. high. It is best planted in good leafy,



moisture- retentive soil, and propagated by division of large clumps.

Cyclamen coum (left) is a hardy cyclamen only 4 ins. high, but capable of providing flowers from midwinter to early spring in a variety of colours. These are based on carmine, including white forms, with small round leaves that may be plain green, marked with silver, or sometimes completely silver. On sale in garden centres as pot grown flowering plants, the corms will increase in size year on year, and produce small balloon-like seed pods, whose seeds germinate freely and will start to flower in two years.

JOHN SCOTT



ellringers came from all over the country and rang the **D** bells in tribute at John Scott's funeral in Great Budworth Church on 9th November. The Church was well filled with family, friends and villagers.

John (left) came from a long-established local family and was born here in Hawthorn Cottage, High Street in 1926, the youngest of ten children. The family soon moved to roomier no.54 where he lived much of his working life. John caught polio in childhood, which left him with a lifetime limp, but it

did not stop him training as a draughtsman and working in the north-east and then for the Atomic Energy Authority and for ICI. Those who lived here in the 1960s and 70s will remember John for his immense contribution to village life. For many years he was Captain of the Budworth bellringers.

As a traction engine enthusiast he organized three steam rallies to raise funds to rehang the Church bells. For years, too, he struggled up the Church tower to wind the clock.

From 1958 to 1976 John also served on the Parish Council, as his father had done before him. Despite his disability everyone knew him as the man who 'got things done' in our village. In his later years John lived in Wincham: he had a fine Cheshire accent, peppered with dialect that is seldom heard these days.



ver the last few weeks you may have noticed two men in high visibility jackets (see right) dangling off the Tower; and no, it wasn't a sponsored abseil you had somehow missed! Colin Brooks and his colleague from Skyline have been undertaking high level repointing and repairs of the Tower stonework (open jointed sills, hood moulds, buttress offsets and window tracery) which were flagged up in the Architect's survey of the Church two years ago. Skyline specialize in high level work and have previously undertaken work at Great Budworth. They certainly provide a talking point for

visitors to the village!

Within the not too distant future another



firm of stonemasons, Malletts, will be doing a lot more re-pointing and repair of the stonework on the lower sections of the Tower and on the south side of the Church. They will also be re-laying the paths from the Lych Gate and the North Gate to the main door, and will be providing a fixed handrail for the Tower staircase, and carrying out an assortment of other small jobs on the building. Things are certainly going to be busy over the next few months - so once again a great big 'thank you' to everyone who has supported the Restoration Appeal so generously.
