The book club are reading 'The Tattooist of Auschwitz' by Heather Morris.



HERITAGE SOCIETY

he Society held its Annual General Meeting at the Parish Hall on Monday 17th June. I reported as follows.

Our main concern during the past year has been the state of the bottom pump house (also known as the 'running pump'). I noted in my report last year that this was in a sorry state – and after the AGM we started to firm up a project to restore it. Keith Brudenell drew up a schedule of work and Rod Bowman has been in serious discussions with CWAC's conservation officer on numerous occasions.

As costs exceeded the Heritage Society's budget - and, as the pump house is owned by the parish council, a number of joint meetings took place. We invited a number of companies to tender for the work but, despite providing them with a clear schedule of work, the response has been poor.

In other areas, the Heritage Society once again organised and funded the community carol singing on Christmas Eve, providing mulled wine and mince pies to those taking part. The organisation went smoothly and our sincere thanks go to Richard Elias and his press-ganged family (who were largely responsible for its smooth running) and to our hardy local musicians for their accompaniment.

In March a hardy team of Heritage Society volunteers set to work with mops, buckets, and scrubbing brushes and cleaned up the village's road signs (see pic, right).

We also organised and hosted an excellent quiz night and hot pot supper, which raised over £600, which will enable us to contribute more to the lower pump house work than we had originally envisaged. My thanks go to Anna Lee for compiling the questions; to Richard Elias for the delicious food - and to everyone on the committee who helped on the night. I must also thank the donors of the wine which was provided on the evening.


