A NEW HAZARD IN WESTAGE LANE?

ocal people may have seen the small notice recently placed on Westage Lane announcing the plan by BT to install six poles to support lines to bring fibre broadband to the housing development attached to Hield House Farm in Dark Lane.

The six poles will be placed at 50 metre intervals on the roadside, outside the hedge, starting halfway from Hield Grove, with the poles linking to the telephone pole on the corner of Heath Lane and Westage Lane.

This stretch of Westage Lane is particularly narrow and winding. It has no pavement, two blind

corners and a speed limit of 60mph! It seems obvious that the hazard could be reduced by placing the poles inside the hedge. This point has been raised with the BT Pole Objection Team.

This length of road is partly within both Cheshire East and Cheshire West. Both authorities have been informed by BT of their plans, but so far they have not responded.

These concerns were raised at Great Budworth Parish Council meeting on 3rd November, when it was decided to raise the road safety issue with BT.

ASTON-BY-BUDWORTH – HIELD GROVE PLAY AREA APPEAL FOR SUPPORT

As you may already know, Aston-by-Budworth resident, Ben Benson Snr, has been campaigning for new play area equipment in the Hield Grove area.

Cllr. Kate Parkinson is helping Mr Benson and, together with the assistance of Cheshire East Council (CEC) and ANSA Environmental Services (a company owned and controlled by CEC), they are applying for a grant to help fund this project. Aston-by-Budworth Parish Council are in full support of this proposal, and Mr Benson has kindly donated £1,000 of his own money to start the ball rolling.

Outdoors play equipment is so important for children and families. It encourages physical activity, a love of the outdoors and quality family and friends time that are so important to a child's development.

We are asking you to write in with letters of support for the project, which can help secure the funding we need.

The last Parish Council meeting was held on 4th November. The agenda items are summarised below:

 A meeting has been held with CW&C Highways: one option being considered is to paint an 'H' bar across the driveways of those properties on High Street whose owners frequently have problems driving into and out of their driveways owing to thoughtless parking.



- A meeting was held between representatives of the PHC and PC. The principles of a new agreement have been tabled for final review.
- 3. Trinity Construction have been appointed to undertake repairs to the Lower Pump House. This work was due to start in mid-October. However, owing to unforeseen circumstances, the work was delayed until the end of November.
- Work was logged with CW&C to clear various drains and gullies in the village. Any similar problems can be logged via the CW&C website (www.cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk/residents/contact-us)
- 5. Concerns have been raised by many regarding dog fouling on The Avenue and Smithy Lane. This has been raised with CW&C, who have attended. Such complaints can be logged via the CW&C website (as at Item 4).
- 6. Cllr Hammond has followed up on concerns raised regarding the increased air traffic noise and has been working with Manchester Airport to understand the implications of the proposed new flight path routes.
- 7. Works have been instructed and completed to clear The Avenue of invasive foliage. Project updates are as follows:
- 1. The measures currently employed to manage parking in the centre of the village are proving unsuccessful. Alternative options are still being considered.
- 2. A bench (donated by the New Year's Eve party organisers) has been installed at the junction of The Avenue and Farthings Lane.
- 3. There are ongoing works required around the village. Anyone prepared to spare some time to volunteer to help out with working groups should forward contact details to Gill Ayres, the Parish Clerk (greatbudworthparishclerk@gmail.com) or contact any of the Parish Councillors (names and contact details are on the village notice board).
