A smost readers will be aware by now, free garden waste collection by the Cheshire West & Chester Council ended in December (readers living within Cheshire East Council are unaffected as their garden waste will continue to be collected without being charged). When garden waste collection resumes at the end of February it will become a chargeable service.

The new service will provide fortnightly collections over 40 weeks of the year, with no

From the archives

A public meeting was held in the club room on Wed 13th January 1932 at 3pm to decide if it were possible to start a branch of the Women's Institute in Great Budworth & District.



Mrs Orr, a county organiser, gave an address explaining fully and clearly the aims and objects of a Wom-

en's Institute and asked the meeting if it was agreeable that a branch be started. Questions were satisfactorily dealt with by Mrs Orr and it was unanimously decided to start a branch and it be called Great Budworth & District Women's Institute.

It was agreed to have a committee of 15 and Mrs Orr suggested names to be put forward by 18^{th} January and on the 20^{th} January a ballot took place. There were 32 names on the ballot paper and the electors had 15 votes. The election took place under the supervision of Mr Browne and Mr Elliott, who acted as tellers.

The results as follows in alphabetical order:

Mrs Adair, Mrs Boyd, Mrs Clements, Miss Egerton Warburton, Mrs Harris, Mrs Holden, Mrs Lassiter, Mrs Love, Mrs G L Love, Mrs Moreton, Mrs Platt, Mrs Shaw, Miss Sherwin, Mrs Shingler, Mrs Southern, Mrs Woodcock.

There was a tie for 15th place so it was agreed to have a committee of 16.

Miss Elizabeth Egerton Warburton was unanimously elected President.

It was decided the monthly meetings be held on the first Wednesday of every month at 2.30pm at Providence House, an age limit of 16 years for members. Members be allowed to bring children up to 5 years of age but it be left to their own discretion when to take the child home.

Miss Egerton Warburton provided tea and entertained the meeting during tea with selections on a gramophone which she kindly brought.

The first meeting proper took place at Providence House on Wednesday 3rd February 1932 at 2.30pm. Miss Egerton Warburton presided.

ongstanding residents of Great Budworth will have been saddened to hear of the deaths of Bill and Audrey Bucknall late last year.

After they were married in 1948 they lived in Cob Cottage in Church Street until 1970, when they took over the running of the post office and shop in the High Street (the property that is



currently on the market), which they ran until 1988. They then retired and moved to the Isle of Wight to join their only son, David, who had married a girl from the Isle of Wight.

Bill (as he was known, although he was actually John William Bucknall) was born in Northwich 1926, so he was 95 when he died just before Christmas. Audrey (née Dickens) was born in Great Budworth in 1929, so she was 92 when she died in late November. Audrey was the elder sister of Shirley Humphreys.

NORMAN BAKER

V any of those who have lived in the village for some years will have been saddened by the death of Norman, who played such an important role in village life. Norman died at home in Comberbach early on Christmas Eve.

Born on Budworth Heath in 1927, Norman attended the village school. Music, and particularly the piano, were his lifetime passions and he became Head of Music at Newton-le-Willows Grammar School and later Lymm Grammar School. Many of those to whom he gave piano lessons remained lifelong friends, including the distinguished pianist Stephen Hough whom Norman taught in his early days.



Norman was the Organist and Choir Master at the Village Church for more than 15 years and was the inspiration and leader of many splendid musical events in the village over the years, which brought such joy to participants and audiences alike.

The many of us who held him dear will miss the warmth of his friendship, and his sense of fun and joy in music, as illustrated in the photo of Norman sharing some music with the late Brenda Hunt a few years ago.
