
Paul was born on 3rd October 1930 in Warrington.

where he grew up during the war, attending Bottler Grammar School. He spent his national service with the Royal Artillery, going through officer training, learning to drive tanks. He then went up to Durham University to study French and German.

After university, he worked in various overseas postings – in Senegal, Ghana and elsewhere. He and Ruth were married in Accra in 1958. Paul then moved to work in Birmingham and then Warrington. He was an active Vice-Chairman of the Amenity (now the Heritage) Society and was for many years a Sidesman at the Church.

Throughout his life Paul had a major interest in sport. At school his interests were rugby, football, cricket and athletics and he went on to play rugby for his university. In later years he concentrated upon tennis and was the Chairman and President of Stockton Heath Tennis Club. He and Ruth were pivotal in setting up the Great Budworth Tennis Club.

Paul leaves behind his loving family: Ruth, his daughters Hilary and Claire and four grandchildren. His funeral will be held at 11.00am on Tuesday 31st May at St. Mary and All Saints Church, Great Budworth. All are welcome to come and celebrate a life well lived.

USERS' ADVISORY GROUP MEETING

n Thursday, 5 May the Trustees of the Parish Hall welcomed users to the advisory group meeting.

Recent projects which have been completed were appreciated by the users represented. These changes include the enhanced lighting with energy efficient LED bulbs which can be adjusted and provide better levels of illumination, the replacement of the double glazed window units (many of which had



become "blown"), the new gas heating system which is both more efficient and significantly guieter, and the re-laying of the unstable paving stones outside the Hall.

The finances are in reasonable state considering the lack of revenue from cancellations due to Covid and the general lockdown. The Charity is attempting to move the bank account from Barclays to the Co-op Bank, but the process is slow and unlikely to be completed in the very near term.

The has been a review of the hire rates, although these have not been significantly increased. They will be kept under regular review, particularly in the light of rising energy prices.

Looking forward, several practical suggestions were made as to further work and improvements to the Hall, including external painting, improved facilities for both the visually impaired and more elderly users and also for ongoing cleaning and maintenance. The Trustees look forward to implementing many of these suggestions in the coming months.

There was a consensus that the Parish Hall is a significant asset to the village and that the recent improvements were to be welcomed.

G reat Budworth Parish Council is looking for a part-time Parish Clerk/RFO to work an average of five hours a week, including attending evening meetings as required.

The successful candidate will work from home, using a computer provided by the Parish Council, and their own telephone, and will be the public's primary point of contact with the Parish Council. They will carry out tasks as allocated by the Parish Council and maintain the Council's accounts. The Parish Council meets six times a year on a bi-monthly basis on a Monday evening.

One of the Parish Council's major tasks is to maintain and protect the high quality of the village environment which draws many visitors. 

SCHOOL NEWS

A nother busy month at Great Budworth Primary School.

Class 1 have used the text The Journey Home, a beautiful story book following a hen - Hattie Peck – on her way home, taking in all the sights and sounds on her journey. The theme of journeys continued in the



Class 2 used the text The Marvellous Case of the Missing Mammoth. The children were very excited to go on their first, class trip to Weaver Hall museum, where they learned all about toys from the past.

Class 3's theme was driven by the text Zeraffa Giraffa, a true story featuring a giraffe named Giraffa who was a gift from the Pasha of Egypt to Charles X of France. The story follows Giraffa's journey from Egypt to her new home in the Jardin des Plantes, Paris, about which the children made some beautifully illustrated information booklets. Alongside this, the children learnt about the wonders of the Ancient Egyptians.

Inspired by world news, Class 4 worked on the theme of Refugees through a poetry unit on New Beginnings. The children listened to different poets such as Michael Rosen and Benjamin Zephaniah perform their poetry. From this they were encouraged to write their own poems about the needs of a refugee making a new start in a new place, in the form of a recipe. The poems were amazing and Sophie, one of our pupils, attended a poetry recital at The Story House theatre in Chester where alongside other children involved in the writing project, she performed her poem. What a fantastic experience and we are very proud of her.

We rounded off our Spring term with a wonderful Easter service in church. The children showed off their Easter bonnets and sang about the good news of the Easter story. FotS held our annual Easter Bingo, which was well attended. Many thanks for the huge bounty of Easter eggs donated by members of our school family.

We have made a great start to our Summer term, full of exciting learning opportunities, sports events and, we hope, long, sunny summer days. Class themes are: Class 1: Dinosaurs; Class 2: Toys in Space; Class 3: Rainforests; Class 4: Conservation.

We have planned a Platinum Jubilee theme week, where we are finding out about our Royal family and have planned lots of creative art activities including making portraits of Queen Elizabeth and designing a royal crown. We shall be exhibiting these in church as part of the village jubilee celebrations. Shirley and Ruth have kindly volunteered to teach our pupils maypole dancing, upholding British traditions.


