
GARDEN CLUB

D-DAY LANDINGS 80th ANNIVERSARY

une 2024 marks the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings and local communities throughout the country are being invited to register their intention or interest in celebrating the event in some way. Your Parish Council has been sent a link to a substantial online document (45 pages) outlining the plans to mark the occasion. These include a National Fish & Chip Day, a Poem for Schools and an



'international tribute' to be made alongside the lighting of a beacon.

The Parish Council is keen to get some idea of local support for such an event. Councillors are mindful of the fact that in the last year the village has celebrated the King's coronation, as well as the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee (which involved the lighting of a beacon). Many villagers also have very clear memories of celebrating the 75th anniversary of D-Day three years ago and the late Queen's Diamond Jubilee a little over 10 years ago, which involved very similar celebratory events.

Last month the Heritage Society Committee decided to invite everyone interest-

ed - especially younger and newer residents - to a public meeting to discuss the aims of the 50-year-old Society and how to achieve them and to determine its future role.

We aren't the only Village body whose activities were hit by COVID, but that hasn't stopped the Heritage Society from meeting two thirds of the repairs bill for the Lower Pump House, or from organising community carol singing on Christmas Eve and commenting on the School's planning application to erect a fence around the village field.

A meeting of Great Budworth Parish Council took place on 10th July. The following is a summary of some of the key matters that were discussed. The full (draft) minutes of the meeting are available on the village website.

Potholes: CW&C Cllr. Phil Marshall advised that CW&C had been awarded an extra £1.7m for the purpose of addressing potholes. He suggested that the PC and residents persist in reporting concerns and to build relationships at CW&C, with



e.g. Jane Black, Head of Highways. Potholes are colour coded for severity: if they are identified as a health and safety hazard they will be repaired within 24 hours.

Bottom pump house repair: Bill Anderson agreed to speak with Richard Janion, a local builder, and request a quotation for a full roof repair as well as a part repair.

Village telephone box repaint: a resident has approached the PC with a request that the village telephone box/mini-library be repainted.

Parish Hall hearing loop: following a discussion it was agreed that at the moment a hearing loop was not necessary and councillors therefore agreed not to make any financial contribution and to revisit the proposition in 2024.

Cllr. Marshall updated the meeting on other matters, as follows: (1) HS2: despite the current petition, HS2 is going ahead, resulting in ten years of disruption across the Borough. (2) Issues of an antisocial nature have occurred in Wincham. These include drug abuse, horse riding, shoplifting and safeguarding relating to young girls. (3) Helen Bromley has been appointed Chief Executive of CW&C following the departure of Ian Ainsworth to Liverpool.

The next Parish Council meeting will take place on Monday 4th September at 7.00pm in the Parish Hall. All members of the public are welcome.


