

Deleting Messages and Managing notifications

How to delete messages:

Place a finger over the message you want to delete and hold it there. A popup will appear, giving you various options, including 'Delete', which appears in red text. Tap 'Delete'. The popup will disappear and the text you want to delete will have a blue circle to the left of it with a tick symbol inside it. You'll notice, too, that all the other texts now have empty circles to the left of them. This gives you the option of deleting any other messages you no longer want. Simply select them and, when you've done that, tap on the wastebasket symbol on the bottom left of the screen. Job done!

Muting/Changing the notification sound:

From the main WhatsApp screen (ie showing ALL WhatsApp messages, not just 'Great Budworth Village' messages), click on the 'Settings' icon at the bottom right of the screen (it's like a steering wheel). Tap on 'Notifications'. This takes you to a screen split in two, giving you notification options in respect of individual messages and group messages. You can then change the sound of either notification: in other words, you can have different sounds for an individual message and for one from a group member. Of course, you can also opt to silence them! As you'll see, when you press 'Sound', you have a wide range of sounds from which to choose.
