
#### **KEEP AN EYE OUT FOR THE ASIAN HORNET!**

The UK's Chief Plant Health Officer urges all beekeepers and the public to be increasingly vigilant to the presence of Asian hornets and to report any sightings.

The Asian hornet is smaller than our native hornet and poses no greater risk to human health than our native wasps and hornets - but it does pose a risk to honey bees and insect pollinators.

Asian hornets are distinctive and can be identified by their very dark body, wide orange

stripe on the fourth abdomen section and yellow leg ends (see pic). Whilst not as large as the European hornet, they are noticeably larger than our wasps and honey bees, as can be seen from this illustration (right). Any sightings can be made via the Asian Hornet Watch App.



Last year a record number of Asian hornets was found in the UK. The Animal and Plant Health Agency's National Bee Unit attended every credible sighting, locating and destroying 72 nests in 56 locations, with the majority of nests found in Kent.

If you suspect you have seen an Asian hornet you should report this using the iPhone and Android app 'Asian Hornet Watch' or by using the report form at: https://risc.brc.ac.uk/alert.php?species=asian\_hornet. Alternatively, you can email: alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk. Do include a photograph if you can safely obtain one. Further information and identification guides are available from DEFRA. Simply do an online search on 'DEFRA non-native species Asian hornet.'

Asian hornets are not yet established in the UK. Early trapping is a key part of surveil-lance for this invasive species and fundamental to eradication efforts.






#### GREAT BUDWORTH CRICKET CLUB

ith the season now well under way and despite some grey clouds and showers, the Great Budworth CC squad has been putting in some solid performances. The planned fixture against High Legh became a victim of the weather but will, we hope, be rearranged for later in the summer.

On Sunday 26th May, we welcomed the return of touring side Gregson CC (based in Lancaster) on the first day of their mini tour to Cheshire. On a damp pitch, Budworth posted 148 all out after 30 overs of a possible 35. In reply, Gregson CC had reached 48 for 3 off 18 overs before the rain which had threatened all day returned to kill off the match. In conceding the game, the Gregson CC captain gave the man of the match award to Matt Hankey for his batting which had anchored the Budworth innings.





In the most recent game, against Kingsley CC, their very young team struggled to get going in the face of a very challenging opening spell by Great Budworth's slow bowler Spencer Osborne. Once again, tight bowling and ever improving fielding (this time bolstered by the javelin arm of Tom Faulkner guesting for the first time) restricted the visitors to 95 from their 35 overs. Budworth made a steady reply to a below par score, the only blemish coming from a well struck but aerial shot by captain Pete Taylor finding the hands of a boundary fielder with pinpoint accuracy! Tom also featured with the bat, scoring the winning runs and receiving the man of the match award. Another win by Great Budworth, this time by four wickets.

Following completion of the pavilion repairs, at the recent cricket committee meeting it was agreed to press ahead with the planned netting facility project. Subject to final costings and details, the scheme will provide a permanent concrete surface with a roll out rubber based carpet and portable net.

As a fund raising initiative, it was agreed to offer the chance for individuals or businesses to sponsor a cricket ball. The club aims to have nearly 20 fixtures per season, and using a new cricket ball for each game represents a significant cost, so any support would be appreciated.
