



Kate Huet MNIMH Medical Herbalist By Appointment: 07525 070431 A meeting of Great Budworth Parish Council took place on Monday 4th September. The following is a summary of some of the key matters that were discussed. The full (draft) minutes of the meeting are available on the village website.

On behalf of a local resident, the Chairman raised a concern relating to the <u>increase in aircraft noise</u> and low flying aircraft over the village in recent weeks. Cllr Lynn Gibbon reported that aircraft have been rerouted owing to the change in wind direction. A resident reported that



he is aware of major consultations taking place regarding Manchester Airport flight paths. Final decisions have not yet been made.

It was reported that three <u>grids in the High Street are blocked</u>. Following heavy rain, flooding occurs on the High Street. Cllr Lynn Gibbon suggested we access the 'Grids & Gullies' page on the CWaC website. This shows the programme of cleaning work scheduled for 2023. Residents can report a blocked grid/gully and the Parish Council can report faults and grids missing from the map.

The Parish Council approved the decision to place a <u>plaque in memory of the late Bert Hunt</u> on the wooden bench outside the Vicarage. The plaque will not be paid for by the Parish Council.

<u>Highways</u> remain a major topic for the Parish Council, with several potholes on Heath Lane still needing attention. Residents have been encouraged to report all highway issues to CWaC via the Highways app. The Parish Council gave agreement for the repainting of the village telephone box and are seeking quotations for the repair of the bottom pump house roof. A water quality test at the bottom pump house was carried out by a member of CWaC on 29/8/2023. The report should take between 8-10 weeks.

<u>Cllr Lynn Gibbon provided updates for August and September 2023</u>. This included:

- Information on a number of monthly newsletters that are available to subscribe to, including Your Streets, Travel and Transport.
- An update on Soot Hill. The scheme is supposedly progressing well and currently
 on budget and on programme for completion in December 2023. Further updates
 can be found on the Soot Hill Website https://
 www.cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk/residents/transport-and-roads/highways/
 major-road-schemes/land-slip-at-soot-hill-northwich.
- A new Ward Plan is being developed around four themes: Highways, Environmental, Education and Health. These are all linked to communities and will provide a ward picture with actions to pursue. The plan will be circulated once completed.
- Solar Together information is available on the CWaC website about joining up

Proveryone with an email address must be familiar with the fraudulent emails (often purporting to come from BT advising us that our bill is ready or that there are messages waiting for us) that arrive in our Inboxes with monotonous



regularity. We delete them, of course, but before doing so it's also a good idea to forward them to the National Cyber Security Centre at report@phishing.gov.uk. They will respond with an email acknowledging receipt and providing you with an update of their activities. For instance, the latest one I received stated:

"As of August 31st 2023, the number of reports received stand at more than 23,927,000, with the removal of more than 142,900 scams across 261,100 URLs." So, I hope you agree that it's worth the small amount of effort. But don't stop there: I also block that email address from sending any further emails before finally deleting it.

PARISH HALL USERS' ADVISORY GROUP

small but committed group of users attended the Parish Hall Users'
Advisory Group meeting on Monday 25th
September. Don Hammond, Chairman of the Charity's Trustees, reported that the somewhat cumbersomely named 'Charity Known as the Village Hall and Bowling Green', had now been wound up and its assets and activities transferred to the new charity, Great Budworth Parish Hall



Charity. As well as being more felicitously named, the new charity is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), which means it is a legal entity – which its predecessor was not. Other Trustees of the charity are: Bill Anderson, Dave Hiett, David Hopkinson, Iain Ritchie, Malcolm Torrance, John Tours, and Bob Wilkinson.

Don Hammond reported that income for the year ending December 2022 was £4,383. Expenditure for the same year was £4828, resulting in a deficit of £445. So far this year income is £3179, with expenditure currently running at £3958, reflecting some modest capital expenditure and increased expenditure on utilities. Funds in the Co-operative Bank stand at £18,805.

There was agreement that hire rates would need to be increased, though the Hall's role as an important community asset would be foremost in reviewing these.

The Trustees are looking for a volunteer to take on the role of Treasurer. David and Janet Hiett were thanked for having shared this role for many years.

Thanks were also extended to Sue Scott for her continuing role as Bookings Clerk and to Pat Collings, who had taken over the cleaning of the hall.

Potential projects were discussed. These included:

- · Refurbishment of the kitchen
- A review of the contents of the loft
- Installing bins in the ladies' WCs for sanitary products.
