
#### **GARDEN CLUB**

#### The Heritage of Great Budworth



More than 20 villagers came to the meeting in the Parish Hall on Wednesday 13th September to share their thoughts about the future of Great Budworth Heritage Society.

COVID and the increasing age of current Committee Members and volunteers have meant the Society has been much less active recently, and so it is hoped to recruit some new, younger, more active members. Great Budworth Parish Council has a lot of responsibility for listed trees and buildings, but there is much else to do!

Formed in 1966, the Heritage Society (originally known as the Amenity Society) is a registered charity and has the following objectives:

To encourage high standards of architecture and town planning in Great Budworth.

To stimulate public interest in and care for the beauty, history and character of the area of Great Budworth and its surroundings.

To encourage the preservation, development and improvement of features of general public amenity or historic interest.

To pursue these ends by means of meeting, exhibitions, lectures, publications, other forms of instruction and publicity, and promotion of schemes of a charitable nature.

The audience was given a brief history of some of its activities over the years, including the contribution of  $\pounds_3$ ,500 toward the recent repair of the Lower Pump House. The Heritage Society was also closely involved in the design of (what were then) the new houses built on Westage Lane in the 1980s/'90s. Architectural drawings were on display, along with other historical documents concerning the Society.

Many years ago Great Budworth was described as the Jewel in the Crown of the (cont'd on next page)


