

DON HAMMOND – an appreciation



service was held in the Parish Church on Saturday 6th July to honour the memory of our own Donald William Hammond. Don was a larger than life figure: his contribution to our village over the nearly 40 years he lived here is hard to overstate.

Don contributed to so many other ventures and had many interests. He was a unitary councillor for many years and chaired our own Parish Council for a couple of periods; for some years he chaired the Church Restoration Fund; he was a non-executive director of Halton Hospital; Chairman of Tatton Constituency; he founded and helped organise all the Big Boys events and also founded, with his first wife, Carole, the Wine Tasting Society.

His niece, Chrissy, delivered a moving—and humorous—eulogy to her uncle. She told us that Don's mother taught both her sons how to cook—a skill that Don developed into the excellent culinary experiences that many of us enjoyed in his company. At school, Don became friends with Edward Bootland, whose first wife, Hilary, described

Don as Edward's 'go-to friend': he later extended that friendship to her, becoming her business mentor.

Don was a serial entrepreneur and business angel: with a flying pig as his logo, he set up and invested in a wide variety of businesses here and overseas, ranging from flooring and medical devices, to short film production (including one which won a BAFTA) and even a breakdancing troop. He loved the variety and was comfortable taking risks.

Don and Carole lived in the village happily for over 30 years. After Carole's death, Don found a new lease of life with his second wife, Karen. The couple married in September 2017 and for the next few years enjoyed a series of adventures together, on cruises, safaris, wine tastings and visiting farflung friends. All this in addition to trips to the races, the opera, galleries and fine restaurants.

In summary, Don was a man who lived life to the full. He will be very much missed in this village of ours.



Kathleen Hickson

Kathleen Hickson, who died in June, was an active member of both the village bowling team and the WI. Born in 1936 at Feldy Oak Farm, she wished to remain there until she died, which her daughter, Lynn and son, Kevin, ensured after she was diagnosed with bone marrow cancer and was told she had just six months to live. Kathleen enjoyed seeing all seven of her grandchildren and the many visitors who came to cheer her up. At the end of her life she received help from the Macmillan nurses four times a day and greatly appreciated all they did. She would have been

A meeting of Great Budworth Parish Council took place on Monday 1st July. The following is a summary of the key matters that were discussed. Full minutes of the meeting will be available on the village website in due course.

The meeting was opened by the Vice-chair, Cllr. Wilkinson, who announced the resignation of Cllr. Hammond, both as Chairman and as a parish councillor. Cllr. Wilkinson and Cllr. Culver were then unanimously elected as Chairman and Vice-Chairman, respectively.

A resident asked about pot holes. The Clerk advised that CW&C lack of funds meant that generally only patching was being done, but High Street was scheduled to be patched $w/c 8^{th}$ July, after which, if further work is needed, the PC can ask for a full re-surfacing.

Reports are being received that the gate onto the school playing field is still being left locked after school has finished and the PC had still not been given a key. A letter was to be sent to the school and the vicar.

The Lower Pump House:

CW&C and the Drinking Water Inspectorate have advised that signage does not remove liability and the only option may be to 'restrict the flow'. Bill Anderson had sent a report that stated that the water could be treated, but at a cost that might be prohibitive. The Clerk to contact CW&C for further testing. She also advised that a tile had slipped from the roof and there was now a hole in it.

Sale of land behind Upper Pump House: The sale was progressing.

Crownest Lane:

Members of the PC met with the owner of Boxhedge Hall, Mr Latif, on the 6th June, and relayed to him residents' concerns regarding the cutting down of trees, work done on the lane and the gates. Mr Latif stated that he only cut down diseased trees or those threatening to fall on his property and the gates were a temporary measure in order to secure his property. He stated that Highways had visited the lane and were happy that he reinstated a hard surface as the previous one had deteriorated underneath vegetation. He advised that at present he had no plans to develop his land, but that if he did, he would be governed by planning laws.

The Clerk reported that she had contacted Highways regarding the extension of the resurfaced lane into the hedgerow line but the response was that it was necessary as the lorries delivering material had been slipping and running into the hedgerow.

Westage Lane:

The Clerk had contacted Aston-by-Budworth PC in April about the potholes and had been advised by its Clerk that Cheshire East reported that the road is not in need of repair, but that it will be put on their 'future rolling programme for Level 2 patching'.
