

Swimming was delayed for a week, but Years 5 and 6 are enjoying their visits to Brio Leisure Centre. We have welcomed eight new pupils to school and our Reception 2025 places are nearly full. Four of our children will become 'Junior Librarians' this month when they complete a special training event in Chester, organised by CWAC's Education Library Service.

#### Resignation:

Cllr Malcolm Torrance has resigned. Chairman Dave Wilkinson thanked him for his service.

#### **Public Forum:**

• Bob Wilkinson updated the Council on the Parish Hall kitchen refurbishment, which was \*nearly complete.

He also raised the issue of the streetlight outside the Parish Hall, which has no power. The Clerk will follow up with CW&C.

#### Finance:

- Bank reconciliations were approved.
- Banking arrangements were discussed. The council approved switching to Lloyds for a debit card and online banking.
- The 2025-2026 budget was signed off.
- A precept request of £11,508.31 will be submitted to CW&C.

Several payments were approved, including salaries, reimbursements, and a donation to the Parish Hall Committee. A Small Grant application by the Budworth Bulletin for the sum of £400 was approved. Current Account balance £8,526.

#### Planning:

A letter was sent to the owners of 50 Church Street regarding planning concerns but a response is still awaited from the CW&C planning department.

## Tree Management:

A tree survey identified priority work, including dead branches and epicormic growth in The Avenue (pictured). A risk assessment and schedule of work were created, and further action will follow after further assessments.

\* The kitchen refurbishment has now been completed.

Next Meeting: Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2025 at 7pm, in the Parish Hall. All are welcome.







# SKYWATCH

The new moon on 29 January means that skies will be dark enough to see more stars than normal. There are no significant meteor showers this month but the planets are very dominant in the southern sky. Mars is close to Earth at present and the red planet is due south halfway up from the horizon in early February. Further to the west is

Jupiter and a good pair of binoculars will pick out its four main moons, which were first observed by the great astronomer, Galileo. Saturn and Venus are visible in the west after sunset, but only for a short time as they follow the sun down. If you are going out to watch please wrap up warm and stay out for at least 20 minutes to allow your eyes



to adjust; and keep away from streetlights, which interfere with viewing. A deck chair is a useful place to sit, so you won't have to crane your neck!

in accountancy and Daicy in engineering. Congratulations to them both! Hopefully, they should now have a bright future.





I t was not a very good start to the New Year as the weather caved in to extreme cold and consequently the speaker, who was coming from Disley, didn't want to make the jour-


ney. The snow continued to fall and the big freeze followed. We decided instead to hold
