On Wednesday 5th March we were visited by local children's author Linda Whipp, who spent the day with our children, running some very creative activities and explaining how she writes her stories.







Tom Acton

19th February 1926 - 21st January 2025

reat Budworth Parish Church was overflowing on the 19th February with people saying goodbye to Tom Acton. It would have been Tom's 99th birthday had he lived a few more weeks. This was a celebration of a life well-lived and a tribute to a man loved and admired by so many in our community. Tom was brought up at the Old Shop, Feldy Green, in Aston by Budworth and at the age of 14 he became a gardener at Arley Hall, eventually rising to the position of Head Gardener. Initially working with the former Lady Ashbrook, Tom oversaw the transition of Arley Garden into its status as one of the finest



gardens in Europe. Tom was a fount of knowledge about all things horticultural, continuing after retirement from Arley to teach at Workers Educational Association classes in Warrington and Manchester until he was 91. Readers of the Budworth Bulletin very much valued the articles Tom contributed monthly until 2016.

- Tree Management: KW could not identify the trees requiring work. The Clerk will
 get a quotation from a local tree surgeon to carry out a further inspection, based
 upon the findings from the latest Tree Management Survey.

Finance:

- Bank reconciliations were reviewed, showing the current account balance as £8,526.39, with the 95-day access account balance of £20,392.92, and the reserve balance of £1,804.50.
- The process to switch the current account to Lloyds is under way, and the Clerk will provide an update once it has been finalised.
- Payments made included Clerk's salary and reimbursements for various expenses. Date of next meeting: 12th May, at 7.00pm, in the Parish Hall, at which the Annual Meeting will also take place. All are welcome to attend.

"Is there something wrong with your food?"

A meeting of Great Budworth Parish Council took place on Monday 3rd March. The following is a summary of the key items that were discussed. Full [draft] minutes of the meeting are available on the village website.

Public Forum:

- Mr. Bob Wilkinson provided an update on the Parish Hall kitchen refurbishment. The kitchen was completed at a cost of £16,000, although the induction hob was recently damaged and needs replacing. Donations covered most of the expenses: a large donation via Karen Hammond in memory of her late husband, Don, was gratefully received.
- A new smart TV has been installed in the Parish Hall with funds from the Ward Members' Grant.
- The Bowling/Tennis Club peppercorn rent was discussed. The Clubs suggested increasing the rent to £5 each, with the Bowling Club covering £10 and reclaiming from the Tennis Club. The Clerk will send bank details for payment before March 31st. Land Registration for the lease was also discussed, with forms already submitted but processing is delayed.

Minutes of Last Meeting:

The minutes from the Parish Council meeting on 6th January were approved.

Action Points from Last Meeting:

 Several actions were completed, including the reporting of streetlight issues; sending emails regarding fingerpost cleaning; and pursuing various other issues such as tree management and the Precept request.

Parish Councillor Reports:

 Cllr. Karen Williams (KW) attended a filming workshop and discussed promoting the village.

Ward Councillor Reports:

- Ward Cllr Lynn Gibbon (LG) discussed issues such as flooding, council tax increases (4.99% increase), and devolution. She is pushing for a meeting to discuss flooding and has raised concerns about the lack of transparency in devolution consultations.
- LG reported on signage cleaning which she had helped to carry out and also discussed local policing concerns.

Progress Reports:

- The Lower Pump House Roof: work has still not been completed. Another contractor will be considered if no progress is made by May.
- Mission Statement: Adopted by the Council. [See page 7] (cont'd on next page)
